#### **Dr Becky Jones-Phillips**

Dr. Becky Jones-Phillips is the Director of Enterprise and Innovation (E&I) at the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine (LSTM), where she leads efforts to accelerate translational research and bring health innovations to market. Her team also develops commercial strategies and builds innovation capacity in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs), focusing on areas like clinical trials, manufacturing, and regulation. She chairs LSTM's Gender Equity Action Committee and leads the Athena Swan Self-Assessment Team. promoting gender equity across the institution. With a background in immunoparasitology and experience in the commercial diagnostics sector, Becky is Principal Investigator on three Research England-funded projects—FLIGHT, SIGHT, and BRITE—and contributes to several others, focusing on implementation and market strategy for public health innovations.

# Dr. Joseph Nagoli



Joseph Nagoli is the Senior Research Coordinator for IFPRI and Policy Hub Leader for the CGIAR in Malawi. He holds a PhD in Urban and Rural Development (Anthropology) from the Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences (SLU) and an MSc in Agriculture, Environment and Development from the University of East Anglia. With over 20 years of research experience and more than 50 publications, his work focuses on political ecology, food systems, natural resources governance, and the blue economy in East and Central Africa and Asia.

Prior to IFPRI, Joseph served as Director of Knowledge and Learning and Acting Director General of the National Planning Commission, where he led the drafting of Malawi 2063 and its first 10-Year Implementation Plan. He helped re-establish the SADC Planning Entities Platform and co-chaired Malawi's Food Systems Transformation Coordination Steering Committee. He also worked with WorldFish Malawi, developing fisheries and aquaculture programs, including improved local tilapia and nutritionfocused fish diets.

### **Prof. Kondwani** Jambo



Professor Kondwani Jambo is a Professor of Immunology and Infection at the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine, with my research primarily based at the Malawi-Liverpool-Wellcome Research Programme (MLW). I serve as the Hub Lead of the Discovery Research Support Hub and am also the President of the Science For All Foundation, initiatives committed to advancing equitable access to science and research opportunities across Africa. My research focuses on understanding the pathogenesis of mucosal-acquired pathogens that pose serious health challenges to low- and middle-income countries, including HIV, Streptococcus pneumoniae. Mycobacterium tuberculosis, and emergina pathogens. We collect samples from the nose, lungs, gut, and genital tract to investigate mucosal immunity, leveraging advanced technologies such as single-cell sequencing, spatial biology, multiplex serology, and flow cytometry. Our vision is to develop, adapt, and optimise immunisation strategies that reduce the transmission and impact of mucosal-acquired infections. Over the course of my career, I have been honoured to receive several prestigious fellowships, including the MRC/FCDO African Research Leader Award, the Wellcome Intermediate Fellowship in Public Health and Tropical Medicine, and, most recently, the Calestous Juma Science Leadership Fellowship from the Gates Foundation.











# Assoc. Prof. Faidess Mwale



Faidess Mwale is an Ass. Professor in Water Resources Engineering and Management in the Department of Civil Engineering at Malawi University of Business and Applied Sciences (MUBAS). She served as Head of Civil Engineering Department between 2015 and 2020 and continues to serve the University through various committees. Her work spans research and consultancies in the area of water resources, water infrastructure, disaster risk and water management. She has supervised postgraduate research both at masters and doctoral levels and has served as examiner at this level both internally and externally. Her expertise has led to collaborations with the University of Bristol, University of Florence Italy, the University of Exeter, University of Tokyo and Loughborough University among others. She has worked on assignments, among others with CIMA Foundation (Italy); JCM Power, Royal HaskoningDHV (Netherlands) and some Water Boards in Malawi. Dr Mwale is a grant reviewer for UK Research and Innovation Global Challenge Research Grants (UKR-GCRG) and has also been a speaker on water management issues.

# Dr. Robert Hanjahanja



Dr Robert Hanjahanja is a Water and Sanitation Specialist with passion for serving the urban poor with sustainable water and sanitation solutions. He is currently Chief Executive Officer for Blantyre Water Board. Prior to this, he was Deputy Chief of Party with RTI for USAID's E-WASH program in Abuja, Nigeria. He also was Chief Director for Irrigation and Water Development in the Ministry of Agriculture & Water Development (Malawi) and is the former CEO for Southern Region Water Board. Prior to this, he was a consultant with Castalia Strategic Advisors in a reform project for Mombasa Water and Sewerage Company. He worked for TetraTech on USAID-SUWASA for 5 years in their regional office in Nairobi and assisted in the development and coordination of their reform initiative for the nine countries that SUWASA worked in i.e. Kenya, South Sudan, Ethiopia, Uganda, Zambia, Mozambique, Nigeria, Liberia and Senegal. He has also been Deputy CEO (Engineering) for Lilongwe Water Board, in Malawi. He was also Country Director for Habitat for Humanity, an NGO which provides sustainable low cost housing solutions for the poor. Robert is a Registered Utility Management Specialist with Institute of Public- Private Partnerships (IP3) in the (USA) and is a Registered Engineer with the Malawi Board of Engineers. He holds a Doctorate in Environmental Engineering from the University of Nairobi with focus on Water Service Delivery Options to the Urban Poor.

Mrs. Pilirani Chuma is the Managing Partner at Macdonald & Don Associates, a Blantyre-based law firm she founded in 2019, offering civil, criminal, corporate, and commercial legal services. Mrs. Chuma began her legal career at Bernhard & Harris before joining Telekom Networks Malawi (TNM) in 2011, where she served as Head of Legal Services and Company Secretary for TNM Mpamba until 2019. She has also lectured part-time at the University of Malawi (2020–2024) and Catholic University of Malawi (2017–2020). A member of the Malawi Law Society and Women's Law Association, she is active in pro bono work supporting women's legal rights.
